#### THE YEAR IN REVIEW

#### **Reduction in Refugee Arrivals**

2018 saw a **40%** reduction in the number of newly arrived refugees sponsored by Calgary RC Diocese, from 505 arrivals in 2017 to **305** in 2018. The reduction occurred as a result of a reduction in the inventory of PSR applications in Visa Offices overseas. IRCC initiated a policy in 2018 to clear the backlog of refugee files overseas and decrease processing time for privately sponsored refugees to one year or less.

#### **Case Review**

IRCC initiated a second policy in 2018 called Case Review or, as it later became known, Quality Assurance. In the 40-year history of the PSR Program in Canada, IRCC had not implemented a practice of following up on the resettlement of newly arrived refugees unless the refugees applied for financial assistance from provincial Social Services during the one-year term of sponsorship responsibility.

In 2018, IRCC began doing follow-up in instances where refugees relocate to another city in Canada during the sponsorship year. Relocating to other cities has been a common practice for refugees throughout the history of the program.

In 2018, IRCC decided to increase resettlement accountability and began sending Case Review letters when they became aware that refugees had moved to a city other than the original destination. Case Review resulted in considerable time being spent by SAHs to follow-up with Co-sponsors, most often relatives of the refugee, and collect details about resettlement progress.

SAHs used IRCC's Settlement Plan as a guide to all the steps that should be covered in the refugee resettlement process.

### Red Wednesday Prayer Service for Persecuted Christians

For the first time in the history of the Sponsorship Program at CCIS, a prayer service for staff and volunteers was held acknowledging the recent and unprecedented level of persecution of Christians in the world.

The prayer service campaign was initiated by the Social Justice Office of Calgary RC Diocese.



#### Bridging Borders Campaign | Canadian Jesuits International | Fr Nawras Sammour


Fr Nawras, Regional Director of the Jesuit Refugee Service in the Middle East, presented the Bridging Borders Campaign at two parishes in the Diocese on November 23-24; St Stephen's Protomaryr Ukrainian Church in Calgary and St Martha's Parish in Lethbridge, Alberta.

The goal of the campaign was to promote dialogue and good-will among people of all faiths and political ideology throughout the Middle East and in the world. The Jesuit Refugee Service aided thousands of refugees and displaced people of all religious faiths, throughout the Syrian War, from 2011 to the present. (See poster at the end of this report.)



2019 marks the **40th anniversary** of the PSR Program. The Government of Canada created the PSR Program in 1979 to allow ordinary Canadians to sponsor 60,000 refugees fleeing the conflict in Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia.

The PSR Program was so successful that in 1986 the people of Canada were awarded the **Nansen Medal** for their humanitarian work, the only time the medal has been awarded to the people of a country. Over the last 40 years, approximately two million Canadians have helped sponsor more than **327,000** refugees.




Their son Lionardo became a Canadian citizen in July.








REFUGEE ARRIVALS 1987-2018


